The more people with criminal histories are able to access supportive community services, the likelier they are not to re-offend. The more we as a society are able to reduce recidivism, the safer and more productive our community will be for all of us.

The Adult & Community Education (ACE) Leon County Transitions Resource Guide 2018-2019 is designed to provide inmates, formerly incarcerated people, counselors, social service providers, probation officers, teachers and community members with information about the many resources available in Leon County. The resources included in this guide address the myriad needs of people re-entering society from incarceration who are ready to make positive changes, find employment, secure a place to live, and who may need medical, substance abuse, mental health and other counseling services.

If you are a formerly incarcerated person, you may not have sought community help in a long time. You may not be comfortable asking for help in person or by phone. You may not have used the Internet much to find information or services.

Don't give up! Help is out there if you know how to ask for it.

When you contact an agency or business for help or information, it's important to be prepared. Think ahead before you call or meet with someone to get answers to your questions. Be prepared to write down the answers you receive. Be aware that many of the agencies will use automated answering services and you will need to listen carefully in order to know what numbers to press to get the answers you need.

Helpline 2-1-1 is a 24/7 hotline that assists people with information and referrals in English and Spanish in all eight counties of the Big Bend. Skilled hotline counselors treat all calls confidentially and anonymously. Counselors help callers assess their needs, provide supportive counseling, provide crisis intervention and suicide prevention, and offer information and referrals to community services. There are no eligibility criteria and services are free.

2-1-1 Big Bend's online community resource directory (www.211bigbend.org) is comprehensive and up-to-date. The referral database contains detailed information about more than 1,200 human service programs and mental health providers in the Big Bend area. 2-1-1 Big Bend offers free iPhone and Android apps that users can download to access the online directory.

BIRTH CERTIFICATE

People who were born in Florida can get a certified birth certificate from the Office of Vital Statistics by bringing a copy of their Leon County Jail Defendant Criminal Records page, which includes a picture and descriptive information, to the Leon County Health Department as verification of identification.
